Juniors Lesson #4

Introduction/Ice Breaker (5 minutes)-

- GOAL: Relationships & Your values: Choices and opportunities that shape your future

How might choices made based on one's values affect the future? <u>Some examples:</u> Cheating on a test, lying to a co-worker or classmate, helping someone fill out an application, defending someone's right to be heard....

Because poor choices have been made in the past, does that mean one can't change? What might help someone to change when peers expect the same behavior as in the past? <u>Examples:</u> try different activities, don't be available, and explain your desire to change to another person for their support such in breaking a habit.

How do choices affect relationships over time? Can you trust someone that isn't truthful? Can you rely on someone that can't keep promises? Would you enjoy doing most of the work and not getting credit for it because your associate claimed they were just as involved? Would you appreciate getting help in difficult situations? Would you rather have the truth even if it hurts a bit?

Complete the Values Ranking Handout and discuss some of the questions at the end of the handout.

*Career Interviews and Shadowing experience opportunities

-After reading and researching about careers, it is worthwhile to validate or check for accuracy with people employed in your area of interest. Career interviews and shadowing gives you an understanding from a person's point of view. You need to prepare yourself with relevant questions, a professional appearance, be prompt for the interview or shadowing experience, and send a personal thank-you soon after the event.

-Interviews may last from 30 minutes to 1.5 hours depending on the person and situation. Shadowing may last from 2 hours to a full workday. You may even get a hands-on experience depending on the situation and nature of the job.

-Often students learn the process by interviewing a family member or adult friend first before setting up an interview with someone working in the career you do not know personally. You may

also explore one or more of the multimedia **Career Cruising Career Interviews**. Use the **Career Cruising Handout** to guide you through the interview process.

Closure (5 mins) –

- Seek to make choices based on values that will guide you toward a successful future in relationships and in careers.
- Explore the Career Cruising interviews you can view online. Then interview someone employed in the career you are interested in.
